### Objectives of the Meeting

Education for Sustainable Development (ESD), in which UNESCO has taken the initiative since 2005, is now undertaken in the Global Action Program (GAP) on ESD, with the purpose of its worldwide spread. Moreover, the promotion of ESD is advocated in the Target 4.7 of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The purpose of this core-to-core program (2017-2019) titled " Formation of International Center of Excellence to Promote Teacher Education on ESD ", in which Okayama University is a core institution and University of Toyama is one of the cooperative institutions, aims to collaboratively develop teacher training programs on ESD based on Lesson Study and to propose their Asian standards, coordinating with core institutions on teacher education in East Asia (China, Korea, and Mongolia) and Southeast Asia (Indonesia, Laos, and Myanmar).

The purpose of this meeting is to discuss the integration of teacher education with ESD and the development of training programs for teachers. The program members have developed some guidelines and recommendations to reorient teacher education in Asia to address sustainability.
